

Pre-Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) Advising Worksheet

Students are placed in the AS Liberal Arts program until accepted into the AAS Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) program (see reverse).

Admissions Requirements

Academic Requirements:

- _____ Submit an online application to the program (<http://www.sunyorange.edu/admissions/healthforms.shtml>)
Please note that this application will serve as a general application to the College as well as the Occupational Therapy Assistant program.
- _____ Submit official high school transcript; or GED with score report
- _____ Submit official college transcripts (if applicable)
- _____ Eligible to take ENG 101
- _____ Eligible to take MAT 101; or higher or have completed MAT 020
- _____ Completion of at least one of the following within 5 years of application deadline: BIO110; BIO 101 **and** BIO 102; BIO 111; or BIO 112 with a 2.00/“C” or higher; AP Biology (score of 3, 4, or 5); or a passing grade on the Biology CLEP exam.
- _____ Minimum program GPA of 2.40 within required/recommended courses for application

Department Specific Requirements:

- _____ Submit Occupational Therapy Pre-Admission Observation Form (15 hour min. with documentation) within 3 years of application deadline.
- _____ Attendance at an OTA pre-admission seminar within 3 years of the application deadline. At this seminar, students will receive and sign off on information pertaining to health forms, drug testing, and criminal record policies.
 Note: If eligible, students will have a follow-up interview, compose an essay, and perform a problem-solving activity with the Department Chair.

Selection Process:

- Students will be considered for admission into this program based on the completion of all academic and department specific requirements, highest combination of program GPA and credits completed toward the program (see below), interview, group problem-solving activity and related essay.
- The Office of Admissions will include all of your pre-requisite courses, in which you receive a “C” (2.00) or higher, in the program GPA calculation and credit review process.

All of the above Academic and Department requirements must be completed on or before February 1st in order for a student to be considered for acceptance into the program for the fall semester.

***Though not admissions requirements, the courses below are required as part of the OTA program and completing them will enhance your eligibility (26 credits).** Please be aware that if you have not taken a course within its designated timeframe, you must retake it.
