- \_\_\_\_\_ Eligible to take MAT 101; or higher or have completed MAT 020 with a DVP
- \_\_\_\_\_ Completion of at least one of the following within 5 years of application deadline: BIO110; BIO 101 and BIO 102; BIO 111; or BIO 112 with a 2.00 (C) or higher; AP Biology (score of 3, 4, or 5); or a passing grade on the Biology CLEP exam.
- Minimum program GPA of 2.40 within required/recommended courses for application

### **Department Specific Requirements:**

- \_\_\_\_\_ Submit Occupational Therapy Pre-Admission Observation Form (15 hour min. with documentation) within 3 years prior to the application deadline.
- Attendance at an OTA pre-admission seminar within 3 years prior to the application deadline. At this seminar, students will receive and sign off on information pertaining to health forms, drug testing, and criminal record policies.
