- _____ Submit an online application to the program (<http://www.sunyorange.edu/admissions/healthforms.shtml>)
 Please note that this application will serve as a general application to the College as well as the Nursing program.
- _____ Submit official high school transcript; or GED with score report
- _____ Submit official college transcripts (if applicable)
- _____ Eligible to take ENG 101
- _____ Eligible to take MAT 102; or have completed MAT 101 or equiv. with a 2.00/“C” or higher
- _____ Completion of at least one of the following: BIO110; BIO 101 **and** BIO 102; BIO 111; or BIO 112 with a 2.00/“C” or higher; AP Biology (score of 3, 4, or 5); or a passing grade on the Biology CLEP exam.
- Note: Per the Nursing Department, if BIO 112 is taken within 5 years of the application deadline, and BIO 111 is outside of the 5-year timeframe, BIO 111 will be counted in the review process.**
- _____ Completion of one of the following within 10 years of application deadline: HS Regents Chemistry course or equiv. with a grade of 75 or higher; AP Chemistry (score 3, 4 or 5); CHM 120 or another college Chemistry w/lab with a grade of 2.00/“C” or higher; or a passing grade on the Chemistry I CLEP exam.
- _____ Minimum program GPA of 2.75 within required/recommended courses for application (except HS Chemistry Regents course).

Department Specific Requirements:

- _____ Take the ATI TEAS exam within 2 years of application deadline, and obtain a minimum score level of BASIC. Students who obtain a higher score will receive stronger consideration. - _____ Complete a Nursing pre-admission seminar online at <http://www.sunyorange.edu/admissions/healthforms.shtml> (valid for 2 years) to receive information about health forms, program standards, and criminal record & drug screening policies. Submit printed certificate to Student Services Central before the application deadline.
- Note: The Nursing Department will review transcripts of those students who have been enrolled in and did not complete a nursing program at SUNY Orange or another college.**

Selection Process:

- Submit online application by **February 1 (Middletown)** or **October 1 (Newburgh)**.
- Students will be considered for admission into this program based on the completion of all mandatory academic and department specific requirements, highest combination of program GPA, ATI TEAS score, and credits completed toward the program (see below), and seats available.
- The Office of Admissions will include all of your pre-requisite courses, in which you receive a “C” (2.00) or higher, in the program GPA calculation and credit review process.

All of the above Academic and Department requirements must be completed on or before February 1st in order for a student to be considered for acceptance into the program for the fall semester in Middletown or on or before October 1st for acceptance into the program for the spring semester in Newburgh.

***Though not admissions requirements, the courses below are required as part of the Nursing program (see reverse) and completing them will enhance your eligibility (26 credits). Please be aware that if you have not taken a course within its designated timeframe, you must retake it.**
