What's in the works for our veterans on campus?

SUNY Orange has implemented a Veterans Task Force which includes three college faculty and four student veterans to come up with ideas on how the college can benefit our non-traditional student body, and then figure out how to get those ideas implemented. VP for Enrollment Management; Mary Roth, Coordinator of Alumni Relations; Russell Hammond, Associate VP for Resource Development; and Suzanne Baumann, Assistant Director of Academic Advising, have worked together with members of the Veterans Club to have a Veterans Resource Center and Lounge put on campus, as well as getting resources from the Veterans Affairs (VA) to be on campus on a regular schedule.

After that, you will be fitted with a stole that will state your status as a veteran, and the branch of military you served at graduation rehersal.
