Admissions Requirements
Academic Requirements:

**Please note that this application will serve as a general application to the College as well as the Nursing program.**
Submit official high school transcript; or GED with score report
Submit official college transcripts (if applicable)
Eligible to take ENG 101
Eligible to take MAT 102; or have completed MAT 101 or equiv. with a 2.00/"C" or higher
Completion of at least <u>one</u> of the following: BIO110; BIO 101 <u>and</u> BIO 102; BIO 111; or BIO 112 with a 2.00/"C" or higher;
AP Biology (score of 3, 4, or 5); or a passing grade on the Biology CLEP exam.
Note: Per the Nursing Department, if BIO 112 is taken within 5 years of the application deadline, and BIO 111 is outsice of the 5-year timeframe, BIO 111 will be counted in the review process.
Completion of <u>one</u> of the following within 10 years of application deadline: HS Regents Chemistry course or equiv. with a gra
of 75 or higher; AP Chemistry (score 3, 4 or 5); CHM 120 or another college Chemistry w/lab with a grade of 2.00/"C" or
higher; or a passing grade on the Chemistry I CLEP exam.
Minimum program GPA of 2.75 within required/recommended courses for application (except HS Chemistry Regents course)
Department Specific Requirements:
Take the ATI TEAS exam within 2 years of application deadline, and obtain a minimum score level of BASIC. Students who

Selection Process:

Advisor

- Submit online application by *February 1 (Middletown)* or *October 1 (Newburgh)*.
- Students will be considered for admission into this program based on the completion of all mandatory academic and department specific requirements, highest combination of program GPA, ATI TEAS score, and credits completed toward the program (see below), and seats available.
- The Office of Admissions will include all of your pre-requisite courses, in which you receive a "C" (2.00) or higher, in the program GPA calculation and credit review process.

All of the above Academic and Department requirements must be completed on or before February 1st in order for a student to be considered for acceptance into the program for the fall semester in Middletown or
