- Applicants will be considered based on the completion of all academic, department, and application requirements, the total number of nonclinical program credits completed (see table above), program GPA and science GPA. For Dental Hygiene, the following courses will be calculated in the science GPA: BIO 115 or BIO 112, BIO 125, & MLT 106.
