Newburgh Day Program: Starts every fall (August) | February 1st application opens - May 1st application deadline
Middletown Day Program: Starts every spring (January) | August 1st application opens - November 1st application deadline

*Students are placed into the AS Liberal Arts program until accepted into the AAS Nursing Program (see reverse) *

Academic Requirements

- ☐ **English pre-requisite:** Completion of ENG 101, Freshman English I
- ☐ **Math pre-requisite:** Eligible to take MAT 102 (Inter Alg) or have completed MAT 120 (Stats) or MAT 102 (Inter Alg) or MAT 121 (College Alg) with a grade of a "C" or higher.
- ☐ **Biology pre-requisite:** Completion of BIO 111, Anatomy & Physiology 1. Must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher within 5 years of the application deadline. For Spring 2026 applicants, BIO 111 must have been completed after November 1, 2020. For Fall 2026 applicants, BIO 111 must have been completed after May 1, 2021.
- ☐ **Microbiology pre-requisite:** Completion of MLT 106, Microbiology for Health Professions. Must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher within 5 years of the application deadline. For Spring 2026 applicants, MLT 106 must have been completed after November 1, 2020. For Fall 2026 applicants, MLT 106 must have been completed after May 1, 2021.
- ☐ **Chemistry pre-requisite:** Completion of one of the following within 10 years of application deadline: HS Regents Chemistry course or equiv. with a grade of 75 or higher; passing grade on the Chemistry CLEP exam; CHM 100 or another college chemistry (with a lab) with a grade of "C" or higher. For Spring 2026 applicants, the chemistry pre-requisite must have been completed after November 1, 2015. For Fall 2026 applicants, the chemistry pre-requisite must have been completed after May 1, 2016.
- ☐ **Minimum program GPA of 2.75** within non-clinical program courses (outlined on page 2).

Articulation Requirement

To meet the articulation agreement requirement, students must have graduated from the Ulster or Orange-Ulster BOCES LPN Program within 5 years of program entry and earned a grade of 85 or higher in their LPN Program. For Spring 2026 applicants, Ulster/OU BOCES LPN Program must have been completed after January 2021. For Fall 2026 applicants, Ulster/OU BOCES LPN Program must have been completed after August 2021.

Testing for Students who do not meet the Articulation agreement

Students who do not meet the articulation requirement must complete the ATI Nursing Content Mastery Series Exam and score Level 1 or higher or have previously taken the Excelsior Exam for Nursing Fundamentals prior to the application deadline and earn a grade of B or higher. Scores cannot be more than 3 years old. For Spring 2026 applicants, the ATI Nursing Content Master Series Exam or Excelsior Exam must have been completed after November 1, 2023. For Fall 2026 applicants, ATI Nursing Content Master Series Exam or Excelsior Exam must have been completed after May 1, 2024. - ☐ **ATI TEAS Exam:** Take the ATI TEAS Exam within 2 years of the application deadline and with a minimum score level of BASIC. A score level of PROFICIENT or higher is recommended. For Spring 2026 applicants, the TEAS Exam must have been completed after November 1, 2023. For Fall 2026 applicants, the TEAS Exam must have been completed after May 1, 2024. - ☐ **Pre-Admission Seminar:** Complete the Nursing Department online pre-admission seminar within 2 years of the application deadline. During this seminar, students receive and sign off on information pertaining to health forms, drug testing, and criminal record policies. For Spring 2026 applicants, the seminar must have been completed after November 1, 2023. For Fall 2026 applicants, the seminar must have been completed after May 1, 2024.

All of the requirements outlined on page one must be completed and submitted to the Office of Admissions by the appropriate application deadline in order to be considered for the program. The application deadline for the Spring LPN to RN Program in Middletown is November 1st, 2025. The application deadline for the Fall LPN to RN Program in Newburgh is May 1, 2026.

Please note, courses **bolded** below are those that MUST be completed prior to the application deadline to be considered for the program. The additional courses listed below that are not **bolded** can enhance your application for consideration. Please be aware that if you have not taken a course within its designated timeframe, you must retake it in order for it to be considered in the review of your application. Only courses completed with a grade of C or better as of the application deadline will be considered. Transfer students will have letter grade(s) from the appropriate courses at previous institutions considered when evaluating the program GPA.

After applying to the program, students may be contacted by the Nursing Department to complete the following requirements:

- ☐ **Successful completion of the Nursing Bridge I course (N3029).** Students will be contacted regarding approval for registration
- ☐ **Clinical Calculations Skill Examination Level I:** Minimum score of 90%. Exam will be given at the conclusion of the Nursing Bridge course
- ☐ **Satisfactory skills performance:** to be evaluated during the Nursing Bridge Course

Selection Process

- All non-clinical program courses listed above with a grade of C or better will be included in the program GPA calculation and credit review. Transfer students will have letter grade(s) from appropriate courses at previous institutions considered when evaluating the program GPA.
- Applicants will be considered based on the completion of all academic, department, and application requirements, ATI TEAS results, the total number of non-clinical program credits completed (see table above), program GPA and science GPA. For Nursing, the following courses will be calculated in the science GPA: BIO 111, BIO 112, and MLT 106.
