Developmental Course Repeat Policy

<u>Academic Policy #27-I</u> Students who receive a grade of "DVF" in a developmental course will be allowed to repeat that developmental course only two additional times for a total of three attempts. If students do not successfully complete a particular developmental course by the third attempt, they will be separated from the College for one year.
