To earn your certificate, students must complete all seminars, Leadership in Action, at least one College Community Role, and a brief reflections for each.

Reflection

Students must provide an overall reflection of their Fall semester sessions. Prompts will be supplied. You may complete a written reflection, a recorded video, a sound recording, a powerpoint, or other form of material submission.

Leadership in Action

January/February

Select a college or community organizational meeting and attend, review, and reflect the leadership and team conversations at the meeting. Was communication clear and effective? When discourse occurred. how was it handled? What problems were discussed and were resolutions agreed upon? Organizational meetings can include a Town Board meeting, a Chamber of Commerce session, a Board of Trustees meeting, etc. The Center for Student Involvement will provide you with some options of meetings, dates, and times to choose from or find your own with approval from the Director of CSI.
