The SUNY Orange Golden Stars LPP offers two dynamic summer opportunities for middle school & high school students of the Newburgh Enlarged City School District at the College's Newburgh campus location.

The middle school program is designed to give students an opportunity to practice STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Math) in real world scenarios. We offer four one-week sessions that have been designed to peak the student's interest and keep them engaged in the learning process. Social emotional development and engagement, a key component to the LPP mission, will also be provided during summer and academic year programming.

All applicants and parents will be invited to attend an information session with program staff prior to starting program.



Middle School Program (grades 6,7,8) *Monday – Thursday 8:30 am- 2:00 pm*

Marble Roller Coaster

July 8-12

Students will gain a better understanding of the principal of energy conservation through the design and implementation of their own roller coasters.

Oil Spills & The Environment

July 15-19

Students will embark on an experiment to understand how oils spills happen, as well as the chemical components needed to safely contain and clean the spill. Students will examine the effects that oils spills have on the environment.

Solar Oven

July 22-26

Students will design, build and test the efficiency of their own solar ovens. Students will gain an understanding of how solar energy works and its ability to be a sustainable resource.

Magnetic Slime

July 29-Aug 1

Students will gain an understanding of how magnets work through other materials. Students gain an understanding of compound materials and how to handle them.

High School Program

Monday – Wednesday 2:30pm-4:30pm

This program, designed specifically for high school students, will cover a variety of topics including: what to expect in high school, positive self- body image, preparing for college and the workforce, and teen dating safety.
