It's Time for the 2018-2019 FAFSA!

It may seem early, but the FAFSA application for the 2018-2019 school year is open! Login to your FAFSA account at https://fafsa.ed.gov to get started. You will need your FSA ID if you have previously applied for aid.

This application will use your 2016 tax returns. The IRS Data Retrieval Tool is ready to use. This should make your application even easier.

Also, when you finish the federal application, be sure to also fill out the New York State application. The excelsior scholarship will be part of this application this year (no separate application required).

If you will be transferring to a new school in the fall, you can add that school to the application at any time. If you need assistance with any piece of financial aid, see your success coach. We would be happy to help!
